RE: Final 2010 Legislative Bill Tracking Report

The attached report contains a summary of the legislation that was tracked for CEAC in your policy committee subject area in 2010. This report also lists the status of the bill and CEAC's position, based on comments received from CEAC.

**Note:** Any bill not chaptered into law was either vetoed by the Governor, or failed passage. This is the end of the second year of the two-year legislative cycle. New bills will be introduced beginning January 2011.

**SB 894** (Committee on Local Government) Local Government Omnibus Act of 2010.

**Introduced:** 1/25/2010

**Status:** 9/30/2010-Chaptered by the Secretary of State, Chapter Number 699, Statutes of 2010

**Summary:** Would repeal this requirement. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**SB 1319** (**Pavley D**) Subdivisions: parcel merger: renewable energy facilities.

**Introduced:** 2/19/2010

**Status:** 9/29/2010-Chaptered by the Secretary of State, Chapter Number 492, Statutes of 2010

**Summary:** Would provide that specified provisions of the act do not prohibit a landowner, local agency, or renewable energy corporation authorized to conduct business in the state from seeking financial assistance from eligible state funding sources to defray the costs of merging parcels on private or public lands, or the costs of establishing or administering a joint powers authority established or authorized to merge parcels on private or public lands for the purpose of siting renewable energy facilities.
