### 13. New Business/Other Items –

- a. Utilizing California Transportation Foundations' (CTF) 501(c)3 for CEAC Scholarship Fund (Crump) Crump reached out to CTF re: hosting the Scholarship fund to take advantage of their 501(c)3 status. Had an encouraging discussion. Scholarship recipients must be interested in entering the Transportation field. CTF will keep an accounting of donations from CEAC. Crump recommends that Scholarship Committee discuss and recommend that we proceed. Discussion ensued about whether CEAC should become a 501(c)3 to encourage tax exempt donations to the scholarship funds. CSAC has created a "foundation." Action Item: Gerety and/or DeChellis will check with CSAC to see if it's a 501(c) 3 and whether CSAC would allow CEAC to move our Scholarship Fund there. Crump will explore getting a proposal on the pros and cons of converting CEAC to a 501(c) 3 from a tax specialist.
- b. CEAC Newsletter Redesign (DeChellis) Gerety received a proposal from a graphic designer to redesign newsletter. The cost is about \$800. For \$1,250 the graphic designer would develop an Adobe template for the newsletter. Content should include more information about what's going on in member counties with more pictures and links to articles. First step, leave format as-is and work on content. Then work on design for a more modern look and feel later. The consensus was to postpone the work proposed by the graphic designer and instead focus on newsletter content.

# 4. **CLODS Report** (CLODS)

Sadjadi commented that the CLODS BBQ was successful. Thanked the host county, and Presleigh on his service.

# 5. **NACE Report** (McGolpin)

Penrose – Laughlin NV Western Region Meeting well attended by CA. Good event.

# 6. **CSAC Report** (CSAC Staff)

- Valentine All policy committees well attended. 2018 will be the first year for CSAC w/o DeAnn Baker and recruiting for replacement has begun. CSAC will be working in support of SB 1 to try to avoid repeal attempt. Two separate repeal efforts are under way: Travis Alan appeal (using as a platform for running for governor) and Carl DeMaio "Right to Vote" appeal. We're in a campaign until 2019 to support SB 1 and oppose the appeal. Agencies should follow SB 1 site on Twitter and retweet information to their constituents. CSAC will sponsor a bill to support "match exchange" of federal money with state money (get more details on this. Discussed at Transportation).
- Gerety 108 attendees from 32 counties at this conference. Several sponsors. Updating roster list.

# 7. Regional Directors Reports

- San Joaquin Valley –Alkhayyat; discussed flood control and solid waste issues within Madera County. Platt redirected Alkhayyat to the purpose of the Director's Report being it was his first meeting. The region has not met yet since he has taken over.
- Riverside Dave Fleisch (for Patty Romo); tour of Seven Oaks Dam last July, will be meeting in again January 18 in Newport Beach to discuss SB1.
- Sacramento Mother Lode Panos; Met at the Sacramento Operations Center on October 11. Mr. "Past" President and Penrose were in attendance. John Harvey of US Pavement Research Center spoke of

- pavement types. Gerety spoke about Counties. Meeting was finished with a lunch (first time in a while).
- Northern California Mattson; Last meeting was Bedroll in early August. Unfortunately, Tom Hunter is stepping down from setting up the meetings, so the future of Bedroll is uncertain at this time. The January meetings have fallen off, so there is a need to reestablish the meetings, possibly Bridge Bay.
- No other regional directors present to give report.

# 8. **Treasurers Report** (Crump) – **Attachment Three** – **Action Item** (2018 CEAC Budget)

- Treasurer's Report: Revenues are on track, and expenditures are less. This was due in part to a payment to Local Streets and Roads Report due next year. Motion to accept report: Presleigh, 2<sup>nd</sup> Porter; Approved.
- 2018 CEAC Budget: Expecting a \$285,000 LS&R payment from the MPO/RTPA this year. Cost for 2022 LS&R Report will be \$300,000.
   CEAC pays half current through dues, \$137,500, so the amount collected will be adjusted accordingly to \$150,000. Assessment changes will be included in the next CEAC Membership invoice to the counties. Change in amount charged will require a vote of the membership.
- Bedroll was included in the budget, but there is uncertainty as to if this
  is going to happen. Sadjadi would like to see the issue related to future
  Bedroll Conferences discussed at a future BOD meeting. Motion to
  approve the budget: Panos, 2<sup>nd</sup> Penrose; Approved.
- Gerety informed the BOD that the CSAC Event Center is now privately owned and the cost to use the facility is significantly higher. She expects the fees for the Policy Conference to be raised to from \$75 to \$100. Tippett commented that the balance between Affiliate Members attending has risen, where the number of Directors is declining. Possibly consider a two tier system where the Affiliates pay a higher price. McNamee commented that the Affiliates are already paying for sponsorship in addition to fees and would have concerns towards the ones already paying a sponsorship fee. Gerety also mentioned that the hotel will likely by \$190 a night.

# 9. **Committee Reports**

Taken out of Order -prior to Item 8

a) Flood Control and Water Resources – Carlson – The Committee focused their discussion on SB5, the Water Bond and SB231 Stormwater. SB5 funding for Flood Control is primarily focused on the Central Valley with limited funds for rest the state. SB231 redefines stormwater to match the same definition of sewer, providing protections under Prop 218 concerning the ability to generate revenues. Concern is the language might not be strong enough, needing a constitutional amendment.

Return to order after discussing Item 8

b) Resource Recovery and Waste Management - Schleich - Committee

- discussion focused on SB1383 Short Lived Climate Pollutants (Lara's Bill) which focus on reduction of methane emissions by reduction of disposing organic waste. Statewide goal is 50% by 2020 and 75% by 2025. This is a state goal, not a local goal. Currently there is a capacity to process 5 million tons annually, but an additional capacity of 15 million needs to be identified. Suggest a letter to CAO's association in the future, and keep informed as things develop.
- c) Surveyor Bronkall Focus was on the new \$75 fee in SB2 concerning recording of documents, and the uncertainty of what the fees apply to, particularly a Record of Survey. BOPELS Survey Section made a presentation. Summary; Land Surveyors are the biggest complainers on other Land Surveyors.
- d) Land Use Bronkall Rule 20A continues to dominate the discussion. It is critical to submit a Letter of Support to CEAC that will be forwarded to the CPUC. Valentine is sending out a reminder e-mail.
- e) Transportation No Report
- f) Oversight and Special Tasks Penrose and Gerety are going to get further clarification concerning the NACE Conference before any action is taken.

### 10. Other Committee Reports

- a) Fellowship McNamee Hospitality Suite and CLODS BBQ were successful. Fellowship will be serving in Monterey.

An evaluation was done to determine if the scholarship program should be set up as a 501c6 to 501c3 to allow for donations to be tax deductible. Other consideration could be to use CSAC or Caltrans Foundation for program but concerned about identity. Found articles of incorporation. Overall this needs further discussion and will be sent to

the scholarship committee, especially considering ongoing revisions to the tax law.
