RE: Call for Legislative/Policy Proposals for 2024 – due COB 8/9/23

County Engineers Association of California (CEAC) is requesting submission of legislative proposals for the second year of the 2023-2024 Legislative Session.

Certain factors will be considered in the review of legislative proposals. These factors will include statewide need for the proposal, the proposal's impact on the 58 counties or a majority of the counties, how the proposal ranks with existing policy priorities, and the level of the proposal's political controversy.

After consideration of legislative proposals by CEAC's relevant policy committees and Board of Directors, proposals may need to be considered and formally adopted as sponsored legislation by the California State Association of Counties (CSAC). Formal adoption may depend in part on whether the proposed legislation is consistent with existing CSAC policy.

The form is also <u>available here</u> on the CEAC website. Submissions will be reviewed and considered during the CEAC Policy Conference, August 24-25, 2023.

Note: All CEAC members are encouraged to generate proposals; however, CEAC respectfully requests that submissions only come from Public Works Directors or Department Heads. This will help staff to collect proposals and ensure that there is no duplication.

CEAC Priorities and Policy Guidelines

CEAC is an important platform that can affect statewide policy changes. It also provides opportunities to improve the profession of county engineering in California. The development of legislative proposals and our CEAC policies are critical in helping CEAC lend its unique insight and expertise to policy discussions on a number of important issues. In order to help with your legislative proposals, we have included CEAC's current policy documents as background.

During the Policy Conference, we will also consider updates to CEAC's Policy and Legislative Priorities and Legislative and Administrative Guidelines for 2023-2024. Staff will bring recommended changes, as needed, to the committees for review.
