Nevada County is governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors elected on a non-partisan, district basis to serve four-year terms. The Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of County government and also serves as the governing body of the Nevada County Sanitation District. The County budget for FY 2022-2023 is \$331 million with a current staff of over 800 employees.

The Public Works Director is an at-will position that reports directly to the Community Development Agency Director and provides expert professional assistance to the Board of Supervisors and County management staff. This position has high level oversight of all activities and operations of the Public Works Department and provides leadership in the on-going management of department programs. The Director is accountable for accomplishing County Public Works goals and objectives.
