


**At Mt. Lassen

ACCOMMODATIONS

Lodging at Camp Tehama is in open-air cabins equipped with bunks and mattresses. The cabins do not have electricity. Attendees need to bring their own bedroll (sleeping bag, towels, toiletries, camp chair, flashlight, etc.). There is a restroom building with flush toilets and hot showers—think summer camp. Parking is limited, so carpooling is encouraged. RVs cannot be accommodated at the camp; however, those wishing to pitch a tent may do so. RV's can be parked at [The Village at Highlands Ranch](#) which offers sites with full hook-ups and is about 5 minutes from Camp Tehama.

For those looking to be more pampered, off-site lodging is available in the area. [Mill Creek Resort](#) has fully-equipped cabins located two miles down the road from Camp Tehama. The [Highlands Ranch Resort](#) is also two miles from Camp Tehama and has well-appointed cottages and smaller hotel rooms. Motels are available in the towns of Mineral and Chester, approximately 10 and 25 minutes from Camp Tehama, respectively.


